Pre- and Perinatal Ecology Michel Odent

« Today, in the era of primal health research, epigenetics and the revolution of the microbiome, it is possible to confirm that pre- and perinatal ecology is the most vital form of human ecology »

ODENT, Dr. Michel



EUROPE – Dad, surgeon, obstetrician, author, speaker.

Born in 1930, Michel Odent was responsible for the surgery and maternity services at Pithiviers hospital (1962-1985) and founder of the Primal Health Research Centre in London. In the 1970s he introduced the concepts of "home like birthing rooms" and birthing pools in hospitals. He is the author of the first article published in the medical literature on birth pools (Lancet 1983), the first article about the initiation of breastfeeding during the hour following birth, and the first article

applying the "Gate Control Theory of Pain" to obstetrics. He created the Primal Health Research database (www.primalhealthresearch.com) and the Womb Ecology website (www.wombecology.com) to showcase prenatal and perinatal ecology as the most vital of human ecology. He is the author of 13 books published in 22 languages.

Between nature and culture Lysane Grégoire

In a time where the advice concerning the care of babies is such overwhelming, contradictory and in constant movement, let's examine what is a baby in an evolutionist perspective. Why is modern obstetrics and childcare so absurd? What is this famous maternal instinct. Myth or reality? A reflexion proposed to reinforce our confidence in the profound nature of the human being, this singular animal.

GREGOIRE, Lysane



QUEBEC – Mom, communicator, author, founding president of the G*roupe MAMAN* (Movement for Autonomy in Maternity and Natural Childbirth).

Lysane Grégoire trained in communication and first worked as a reports producer. As Vice President of Naissance-Renaissance, she represented the users at the assessment Board for the midwives pilot projects in 1996. In the 2000s she was Managing Director of the Association pour la Santé Publique du Québec and a member of the MSSS Lactation Consultation Table, and she helped oversee the

publication at Les Éditions du Remue-Ménage of two collections of testimonies and reflections: *Au Coeur de la Naissance*, about birth, and *Près du Coeur*, about breastfeeding. Since 2009, she has run Mieux-Naître à Laval, a center for perinatal resources and integrating a home birth under the same roof, the first project of social economy in Quebec.

Charles E Caouette is an Honorary Professor in the Department of Educational Psychology at the University of Montreal where he had taught from 1968 to 1998. He has worked in various disadvantaged and community settings. He is also recognized as a pioneer in alternative education, having co-founded Jonathan Elementary School and École Secondaire Le Vitrail. In recent years, he is particularly concerned with improving the quality of life for the elderly, or those in the process of becoming

Not a drawing, not childish Arno Stern

Is what a child traces amazing? Is it an early stage, a sort of incomplete artistic manifestation? The product of an uncontrolled fantasy? A false outlook, half a century old, that carried on until today? So much mistakes and clumsiness committed by ignorance!

What a child traces belong to an original and universal code; it isn't the product of fantasy, nor the early stages of art.

This code - the Formulation - that emerges early in early childhood, accompanies the person for her whole life. The Formulation doesn't produce images for contemplation, it doesn,'t convey messages. It draws her substance in a memory hidden from inquiry. To who it is granted, thanks to the *game of painting*, lives an accomplishment. The knowledge of the Formulation gives an other look at the trace, beyond cultural bias and the usual value judgments.

STERN, Arno



FRANCE – Dad, Grandpa, author, speaker.

Arno Stern, born in 1924 in Kassel (Germany) and now a French citizen, is a researcher and teacher. He was 22 years old when he began working at an institution for war orphans. Ordered to keep the children busy, he had them painting and quickly realized the vital role that this game causes, and for which he created an original design. In 1950, he was appointed UNESCO technical expert at the Bristol International Congress. In 1953, he founded the "Académie du Jeudi", which guickly

became famous. Between 1967 and 1972 he extended the field of his studies while staying with non-schooled populations (Mauritania, Peru, Niger, Guatemala, Mexico, Ethiopia, Afghanistan, New Guinea ...) and demonstrated the universality of the phenomenon he discovered. He founded a new science, Semiology of Expression, and provided a framework by creating the R.I.S.E. (the Research Institute for the Semiology of Expression) where he trains hundreds of practitioners from all parts of the world. And 2013 marked the foundation of the Institute Arno Stern (a laboratory for the observation and preservation of the child's innate dispositions).

The contribution of an undisciplined approach in education Thierry Pardo

Our time lacks space. Childhood, confined between the wall of the class, suffers the structural oppression of the programs, the disciplines and the authorities which promise *emancipation*, deprives him of of his legitimate link with nature and a diversified and fertile social environment. This presentation approaches how a libertarian perspective can answer positively the child's aspirations for discovery, the outdoors and encounters. The author proposes the basis for an education without schooling, resulting from his experience as a parent and twelve years of research exploring the immense possibilités to an ecological approach to education.

PARDO, Thierry

QUEBEC - Dad, Ph.D. Education, associate researcher of the Centre for environmental educational research and training at UQAM (University of Quebec in Montreal) and member of socio-scientific committee for the World Education Congress on the environment Marrakech (2013). He is also a trainer for the Youth Commission of the European Union.

Thierry Pardo is the author of several essays, including "Héritages Buissonniers" (Babio) devoted to ethnopedagogy in traditional societies, and "La pédagogie de l'ailleurs ou pourquoi voyager avec ses enfants" (with Laurie Cardonnel, Michel Brûlé, 2011). His book *Une éducation sans école* (Écosociété), the result of twelve years of research, has just been published. A storyteller, in 2009 and 2010 he led the Environmental Tales Festival in Montreal, and he contributed to *Contes verts pour une planète bleue* (Michel Brûlé, 2009). He also teaches Aikido (2nd Dan, International School of Traditional Aikido) and is a sailor and musician, but he's mostly dad to two beautiful boys, Lylhèm and Eÿkèm.

While ecology works to find the natural in nature, the ecology of childhood endeavours to rediscover and protect the spontaneous dispositions, the rhythms and the necessities of the child, often forgotten in our days, crushed by the weight of artificial teaching, unnatural paces and destructive competition. Who doesn't wish to know the favorable conditions forming the countless potentials that we are born with? And who doesn't wish to have the consciousness of what becomes of a child who, deeply rooted in our society and it's modernity, grows in this ecology of childhood. Which teen, which adult will he become? We already imagine that a child that is seen and respected, will be an adult that sees and respects... and that he will life a profound consciousness in his roll in the big picture of nature. André stern lives since the beginning in this Ecology of childhood, from the beginning of his childhood to his own fatherhood, and delivers us a unique testimony, which isn't a personal merit, since this disposition is unique to each child - just like, inevitably, grows the mango stone soaked in water...

André Stern was appointed Director of the Initiative for Men for Tomorrow by Prof. Dr. Gerald Hüther, researcher in advanced neurobiology. He is the founder of the movements Ecology of Education and Ecology of Childhood, and Director of the Institute Arno Stern. His work in the media and his activities as a university lecturer,

with both educational professionals and the general public, address a growing interest on the part of all those who, directly or indirectly, live and work with children.
